

Our Saviour Lutheran Church

An Easter Sunday service on April 9, 1950 above the Coscarelli Restaurant on Main Street marked the first service of Our Saviour Congregation in Hudson.

The Walther League of St. Johns Lutheran Church in Adrian had conducted a survey of the Hudson area. Reverend Miller of St. Johns, along with the members, continued the work in the area, assisted during the summer months by Vicar Gordon Light, a student from Concordia Seminary of Springfield, Illinois.

A small chapel was built and dedicated in January 1951 with seven charter families. In September 1951 a parsonage was dedicated. The membership continued to grow and in 1972 a larger, permanent building was dedicated, seating 175 people, with six classrooms for Sunday School and Bible classes. This new building is located on North Maple Grove Avenue.
