

## 200 South Church Street

This large home was built for Dr. Isaac L Spaulding in 1909, at the cost of \$3,500.00 by Charles Matthes and Son of Adrian. The skeletal lumber is 2" x 8", the trim is oak, cypress and hard pine. The home has been kept in original condition and features an oak staircase and leaded glass windows. The kitchen has handmade pine floor-to-ceiling cupboards. A dumb waiter ran from the kitchen to the basement; it was used to carry stored food and firewood up from the basement.

It was not unusual, as verbal history tells us, for Dr. Spaulding to do minor emergency surgery and first aid in his parlor.

After Dr. Spaulding's death, his son Lewis sold this home to the Driskill family.
