

760 North Maple Grove Avenue

This home was built in the 1840's and is believed to be one of the oldest homes in Hudson. Possibly built by Mr. Palmer, a reliable and successful businessman, owing Palmer and Son Hardware.

Mr. George Williams and family also lived in this home. Mr. William's daughter, Ann Sophia, married Mr. G. I. Thompson.

The Fred Taylor family lived here and conducted a monument business.

In the early 1970's the interior of the home was completely restored by the James Lemons family. The Lemons added the kitchen area but the basic structure of the home has remained unchanged.

The house was the home of the Robert Hall family where art classes were held.

The house is presently owned by the Hartmann Family.
