Leaves & Twigs placed in biodegradable yard bags
Sticks & Limbs placed going in the same direction and no longer than 5-feet long

Weather & Emergency



A **Snow Emergency** may be declared by the City Manager when snow or ice, or combination thereof interferes with the proper removal of accumulated snow and ice from any city streets, highways or city owned parking lots.

(Ord. No. 393.14, 1-6-15)

Within 12 hours of declaring a Snow Emergency, PARKING IS PROHIBITED on ALL STREETS and in CITY OWNED PARKING LOTS within the City of Hudson.

City Owned Parking Lots are located:

- * between Lane and N. Church
- * between N. Church and N. Market
- * between S. Church and S. Market

Those vehicles remaining on city streets or in city parking lots may be ticketed and towed at the owner's expense. If you do not have a driveway, you will need to move your vehicle into your yard or make other arrangements for the duration of the Snow Emergency.
