Fall clean-up is **Saturday**, **October 21st**. All items for general pick-up must be curbside by 7:00 a.m. on this day but no earlier than **seven (7) days before** the pick-up date.

Items that **CANNOT** be disposed of on this day are:

- •vehicle tires
- •refrigerators (without a CFC sticker & door removed)
- batteries
- •paint or stain cans, liquids of any type
- •large auto parts
- •fluorescent bulbs
- •bricks, concrete, or cement blocks.

Please remember that if articles are placed at the curb after your street has been picked up, the crews will not return to that particular street, and items should be removed from the curbside by 7:00 a.m. the following morning. **Refuse**
